THE HISTORY OF THE TURNER PRIZE

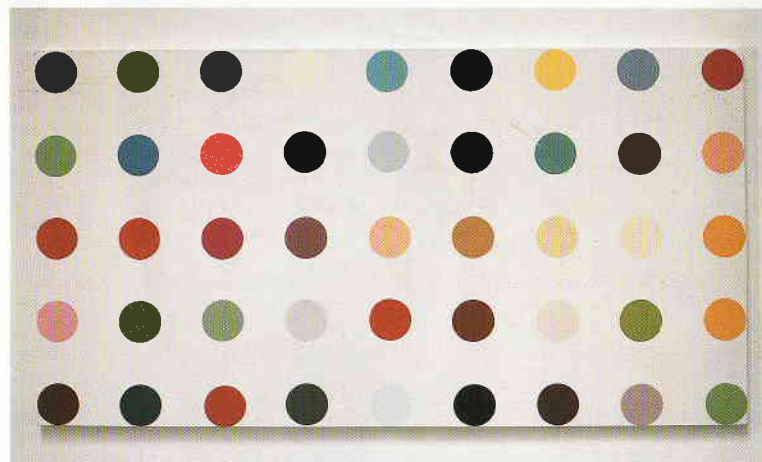
20 NOVEMBER 1999 to 23 JANUARY 2000

Curated by Louise Hallett, this exhibition brings together major work by the winners of the prestigious Turner Prize since its inception in 1984. This award aims to bring contemporary British art to a wide audience - an ideal not dissimilar to ArtSway's own. The History of the Turner Prize, which coincides with this year's Turner Prize exhibition at the Tate Gallery, will not only be a celebration of its success, but a review of its role in the contemporary art world, an analysis of how this role has changed over the years and a consideration of the future of the prize in the next millennium. Anna Best and Ella Gibbs collaborate on a commissioned live event for the Millennium at ArtSway. They propose a participatory project with people from Sway and people from elsewhere during New Year's Eve and New Year's day.

The twin phenomena of "documentation" and "celebration" will be explored by spending this intense short time recording, mixing, editing, playing, repeating and producing in a wide range of media (using everyday technology from video and computers to writing and putting the kettle on).

Process and production create a live event, a momentary landscape of interpretations. Video will be used in an innovative way as a cupboard into which all the traces of activity are heaped and you cannot see the wood for the trees.

Elpida Hadzi-Vasileva was artist-in-residence during summer 1999 as part of ArtSway's 'The World of Our Landscape' A4E programme.

She spent eight weeks with us exploring the theme of 'The Changing World' and this exhibition is in part a result of this residency.

Elpida Hadzi-Vasileva will install new work specifically created for each of ArtSway's gallery spaces, both responding to the gallery environment and challenging our expectations of what can be achieved with unexpected but everyday materials.



Elpida is a sculptor and graduate of Glasgow School of Art and the Royal College, whose work uses natural materials to explore ideas of form and space, memory and the concealed.

ABOUT ARTSWAY

Launched in January 1997, ArtSway continues to present a changing exhibition programme bringing the best in contemporary visual art to a wide audience.

This winter we are presenting a major exhibition of Turner Prize winners, a survey bringing together important works by established British artists. This is followed by a first major solo exhibition in the UK by Elpida Hadzi-Vasileva, our third artist in residence in The World of Our Landscape series.

ArtSway's exhibitions are accompanied by a range of talks, tours, workshops and off-site projects. Most of these are open to the public while others are specifically organised for schools, colleges and other groups in the community. Artists are always employed to lead these projects. We seek to involve everyone from preschool to continued learning across the entire community.

Look out for new initiatives launching this season - Craft & Multiple Cabinets for a rolling programme of ceramics, jewellery, textiles and editioned art; Creative Media Suite for fast internet access, creative use of new technologies and computer awareness. These offer new opportunities for both artists and the community to get involved as well as making the gallery a more useful and creative local resource.

Regular activities continue such as After School Art Classes, Little Dragons and Life Drawing, as well as an Open Studio day where you can meet ArtSway's artists and discuss their work and practice.

The World of Our Landscape programme enters its final year - watch out for separate publicity promoting some very special events.

As ever we remain continually grateful to all of you who continue to support this thriving, lively and active resource sensitive to the needs of the local area and its visitors.

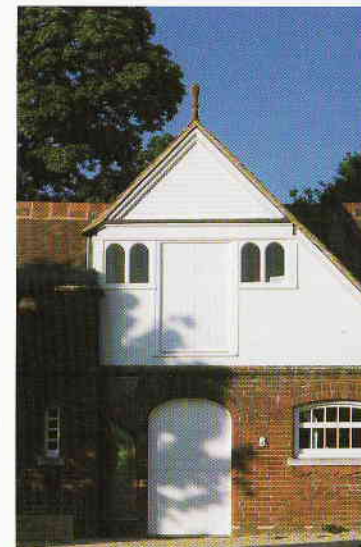


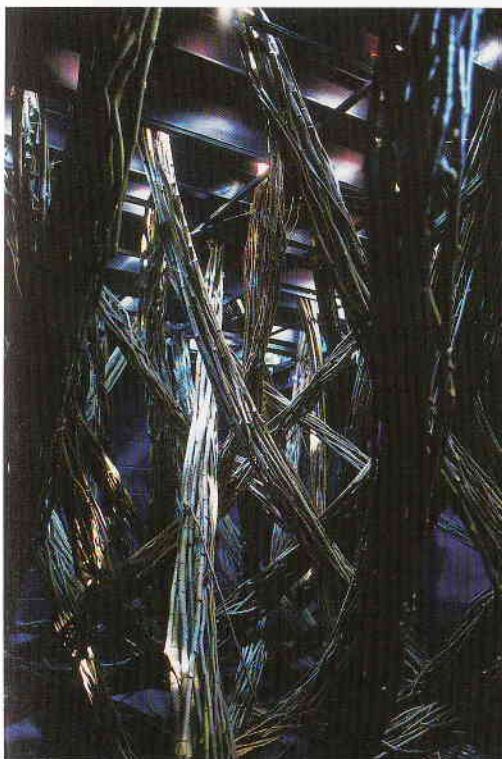
